Non-discriminatory Admissions Policy

Admissions at Shiv Nadar IoE are based on merit that includes performance in board examinations and/or other competitive entrance tests, along with a specially crafted in-house aptitude and subject proficiency tests. This is followed by interviews conducted by the faculty for undergraduates. The respective departments conduct selection and admissions to our master's and doctoral programs. The criteria are designed such that there are no discrimination and bias in the selection process.

Scholarships for underrepresented groups

The university offers scholarships and financial aid to students to ensure that no deserving candidate is deprived of quality education. This also provides equal opportunities for students belonging to underrepresented groups like low income or socially disadvantaged groups. The different types of scholarships are:

- Merit Based Scholarship based on class 12th result and JEE Main scores
- Scholarship for Candidates from Low-income Households
- School Topper's Scholarship
- Vice Chancellor's Scholarships
- Women in B.Tech. Scholarships
- Sports Scholarship
- Scholarships to the wards of defense personal from Indian Army, Navy, Air Force, and Coastguard
- College Board India Scholarship

Application process for tracking applications for underrepresented groups

The university has a digital application system for applications to various programs. Prospective students begin their applications by registering on the official website. The application form is designed to capture personal as well as other details to identify low-income students, students belonging to socially disadvantaged groups, ethnic minorities, non-traditional students, women, LGBT students, disabled students, and newly settled refugee students.

Recruitment and outreach for underrepresented groups

Equal opportunities are provided for all qualified students to have diversity in the classrooms. The university conducts extensive outreach in JCK, Odisha, Gujarat, and all northeastern states to aware and attract underrepresented communities, we conduct regular interaction and counseling sessions in the NGO schools, Government Schools, Schools managed by Trust and Foundation. The university ensures the adequate arrangement and facilities are made available to disabled, LGBT, and third gender students. The university is trying to establish the equal male and female student ratio by doing extensive outreach in girls' schools and offering dedicated scholarship to female students opting B. Tech. programs.
