### International Collaboration on Comparative Global Health Approaches and SDG Best Practices

Shiv Nadar University participates in international collaboration and research to review comparative approaches and develop best practices for tackling the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). As part of the **New Frontiers Grants Program at Cornell University**, the project *“The Biopolitics of Global Health After Covid”* (2023–25) unites researchers from **Shiv Nadar University (India), Cornell University (USA), and the University of Salerno (Italy)**. Led at Shiv Nadar University by Prof. Yasmeeen Arif from the Department of Sociology, the collaboration explores how the COVID-19 pandemic reshaped understandings of global health, ethics, and governance.

The project examines comparative responses between the Global North and South, identifying inequities in health management, institutional resilience, and ethical practice. Through this international dialogue among sociologists, philosophers, and anthropologists, the partners aim to develop inclusive frameworks and global best practices that strengthen health systems and prepare institutions for future global challenges.

By contributing region-specific insights from the Global South, Shiv Nadar University advances evidence-based, comparative approaches to achieving SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-being) and SDG 10 (Reduced Inequalities).
