Item 1: Welcome address by the Chair

Prof. Ananya Mukherjee welcomed the members to the IQAC meeting for the Academic Year 2025-26. Prof. Mukherjee then requested Dr. Rakesh Ganguly, Coordinator of the IQAC to take forward the discussion. Dr. Rakesh Ganguly welcomed and thanked the members for their participation. He shared the presentation for the meeting agenda, important updates, and further planning on related matters.

Item 2: Ratification of the Minutes of the Meeting held on 14 February 2025

The minutes of the meeting held on 14 February 2025, as circulated to the members earlier, were approved.

Item 3: Graduates of 2025 and Incoming batch of 2025

Mr. Sudhir Naudiyal, Registrar presented to the AC the final list of 907 students (UG – 694, PG – 151, and Ph.D. – 62) who were awarded degrees upon successful completion of their respective programs during the Convocation. The school wise summary is as follows:

The Registrar also informed the IQAC regarding the incoming batch for the Academic Year 2025-26 and the Orientation program scheduled for 8 August 2025.

Item 4: The new curriculum structure and new course codes in alignment with the New Education Policy (NEP)

Dr. Ankur Mehra, Assistant Professor, School of Management and Entrepreneurship (SME) & Associate Dean (Academics), presented the revised curriculum structure and the updated course coding system to the IQAC. These revisions have been developed in alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) for both undergraduate and postgraduate programs across the University and approved by the Academic Council in the meeting dated 25 July 2025.

Credit and Learning Requirements

Credit Definition: 1 credit is equivalent to 30 Notional Learning Hours.

Credit Requirements

Four-Year Undergraduate Programs: Minimum 160 credits

Two-Year Master's Programs: Minimum 80 credits

One-Year Master's Programs: Minimum 40 credits NCrf Credit Levels

Undergraduate Programs

Students must accumulate a minimum of 840 NCrf credit points across all courses to be eligible for the award of a four-year undergraduate degree. Students in the fourth year may enroll in 500-level courses with prior approval.

Postgraduate Programs

One-Year Master's Degree: Minimum 260 NCrf credit points required

Two-Year Master's Degree: Minimum 520 NCrf credit points required Master's students may take 400-level courses subject to approval.

Doctoral Programs

Courses at the doctoral level are designated as 800-level.

Item 5: Information of the FPD 2025

Prof. Partha Chatterjee, Dean Academics reported the recently concluded Faculty Professional Development Program 2025 for the faculty. Providing the overview, Prof Chatterjee informed the IQAC that the Five-day session titled, “Reimagining Academic Practice: Leadership, Pedagogy, and Purpose in a Changing University” was held from 28 July to 1 August 2025. The program saw engagement of faculty with the evolving contours of pedagogy, curriculum design, interdisciplinarity, inclusion, mentorship, and academic policy. Each day carried forward the discussions from the previous day moving from strategic leadership and pedagogical innovation, through curriculum renewal and inclusive teaching, to the opportunities and ethical considerations presented by AI, and culminating in discussions on faculty mentorship and academic governance.

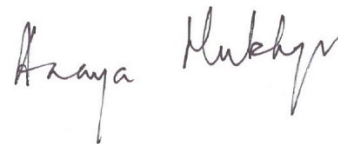
Prof Chatterjee also informed about the new curriculum discussions for the School of Humanities and Social Sciences and School of Natural Sciences.
