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Item No.2 Confirmation of the Minutes of the meeting IQAC held on 23rd May 2017

The minutes of the meeting of the IQAC meeting held on 23rd May 2017 were circulated to members and no comments were since received. The minutes as circulated were approved by the Committee.

Item No.3 To discuss alignment of the credit requirements in the UG programs conducted under SoNS, SoHSS and SoME

The members discussed that there is requirements from various departments of non-engineering courses to align the credit requirements of existing courses with UGC's Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) guidelines. It was pointed out that in CBCS guidelines, the minimum requirements for UG Honours level courses is 148 credits. Keeping in view SNU's research based learning approach, the credits for all non-engineering UG courses are set at 150. The Chairperson suggested to the Dean, UGS to bring this agenda in the next AC meeting with full details of syllabus and credit requirements for the approval of the Academic Council, so that it will be implemented from the Monsoon 2018 semester.
